Understanding Human Trafficking & Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM)

Children are vulnerable, and today's world presents unique challenges. As parents and caregivers, we can work together to protect them from exploitation and harm.

What is Human Trafficking?

Exploiting individuals for labor, services, or commercial sex through force, fraud, or coercion.

What is CSAM?

Child Sexual Abuse Materials refer to any material that depicts sexually explicit conduct involving a minor.

How To Protect Our Children

- Educate Them: Talk about safe boundaries, online dangers, and trafficking risks in ageappropriate ways.
- Monitor Their Activity: Know their friends, activities, and online interactions. Use parental controls when possible.
- Build Trust: Create an open environment where your child feels safe to share concerns.
- Be Aware: Look for unusual behavior or reluctance to be around specific people.
- Stay Informed: Learn about signs of trafficking and local resources.

Signs of Trafficking or Exploitation in Children

- Unexplained Possessions: A child has unexplained cash, prepaid cards, hotel keys, multiple cell phones, or apps providing multiple phone numbers without a clear source.
- Lack of Identification: The child's ID is held by another person, or they do not possess any identification documents.
- Coached Communication: The child appears to be coached when speaking, allows others to speak for them, or looks to others before responding.
- Frequent Runaway or Homelessness: The child frequently runs away or experiences unstable housing situations.
- Sudden Isolation: The child abruptly disconnects from family and friends.
